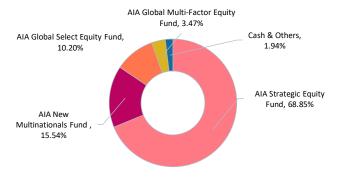

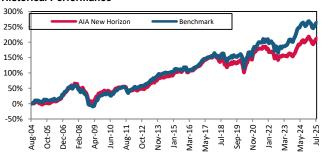

Market Review

The FBMKLCI ("Index") fell 1.3% Month-on-Month ("MoM") to close at 1,513 pts in July 2025. The Index underperformed the MSCI Asia ex Japan Index, which gained 3.7% MoM in Malaysian Ringgit ("MYR") terms over the same period. Foreign investors turned net sellers of Malaysian equities with net sell flows of MYR0.9billion while local institutions remained net buyers amounting to MYR0.1billion during the month. Bursa Malaysia's average daily transaction value ("ADTV") rose 9.7% MoM to MYR2.4billion in July 2025. During the month, Axiata (+16.9%), Nestle Malaysia (+14.8%) and Petronas Chemical (+11.2%) were the key gainers while key detractors were Tenaga Nasional (-9.5%), PPB Group (-8.3%) and QL Resources (-7.6%). Sector wise, Construction (+4.2%), REIT (+4.2%) and Industrial Production (+3.5%) were the key performers, while Healthcare (-3.3%), Finance (-2.8%) and Transport (-0.4%) were the key detractors. Major news during the month include Bank Negara Malaysia lowered the Overnight Policy Rate by 25bps to 2.75%, the United States officially informed Malaysia that a 25% tariff will be applied to all Malaysian products and Malaysia unveiled the 13th Malaysian Plan with annual Gross Domestic Product ("GDP") growth target of 4.5% to 5.5% for the 2026-2030.

Global equity markets extended gains in July 2025, with the MSCI AC World Index up +1.3% MoM. The S&P 500 rose +2.2% MoM, supported by easing tariffs, reduced trade tensions, a strong Q2 2025 earnings season, and a resilient macro backdrop. Trade agreements and several pre-deadline deals played a notable role in lifting sentiment. The MSCI Asia-ex Japan Index gained +2.27% MoM in US dollar ("USD") terms, with Thailand and Korea leading on strong foreign inflows. Thailand rebounded sharply on expectations that US tariff negotiations will conclude at a rate below 20%, lower than the previously feared 36%. Korea rallied after announcing preliminary cut in the import tariff agreement with the US from 25% to 15%, alongside solid Artificial Intelligence ("Al")-related earnings. China gained on stronger growth proxies in biotech and hardware, as well as positive policy signals. India underperformed due to foreign outflows, concerns over potential US tariff penalties, and Indian Rupee ("INR") depreciation.

Market Outlook

We are cautiously optimistic on equities, as recent developments in the US-China trade talks have helped avert a worst-case scenario and reduced the likelihood of a US recession. These developments have also helped stabilize the trend of negative earnings revisions. Nonetheless, some risks persist. The US-China negotiations remain fragile, and any unexpected setback could quickly escalate tensions. Furthermore, the ongoing effects of trade tariffs are already weighing on corporate sentiment, leading to capital expenditure cut and a more subdued business outlook. Additionally, Trump tariff is expected to stoke inflation, which could limit macroeconomic policy flexibility. We continue to adjust the portfolio proactively to manage risks and capture opportunities as they arise.

As for Malaysia, we remain cautiously constructive on the equity market, though volatility is expected to persist amid evolving Al governance, trade recalibrations, and domestic policy shifts. The finalization of the National Al Action Plan and new export controls on high-performance chips reflect Malaysia's alignment with global standards but add complexity for tech exporters. While the US-Malaysia tariff rate was lowered to 19%, lingering uncertainty around broader trade frameworks continues to weigh on sentiment. Corporate earnings have been mixed, with strength in logistics, REITs, and semiconductors offset by margin pressures in consumer and healthcare sectors. We continue to actively position the portfolio toward high-quality domestic names, with a focus on construction, renewable energy, and data infrastructure plays. Our strategy remains anchored in fundamentals and policy tailwinds, while maintaining disciplined risk management amid macro and geopolitical uncertainty
